



Sexual misconduct and intimate partner violence are a violation of Title IX. Sexual misconduct includes sexual harassment, sexual assault, rape, stalking and intimate partner violence.

- 1. If someone tells you that they were sexually harassed. assaulted, raped or stalked, first offer them support. But emphasize to them that as a faculty member. staff member, student leader or other employee of the College with supervisory and leadership responsibilities, you are required to report sexual misconduct. As a responsible employee, you are a private resource, but not a confidential resource
- 2. Listen to them and encourage them to seek help and counseling as soon as possible.
- 3. The person's health and safety should be your primary concern. If the person's health and safety are in jeopardy, contact Campus Safety at 909.607.2000 or local law enforcement at 911
- 4. Give the person a copy of this information so they have a helpful reference.
- 5. Report the incident to the Harvey Mudd College Title IX coordinator.
- 6. If there is any question about how to proceed after a conversation with someone who has experienced sexual misconduct or partner violence, contact the Title IX Coordinator Jennifer Alanis at 909.607.3148
