If Someone Tells You They Have Experienced Sexual Misconduct or Intimate Partner Violence

Sexual misconduct and intimate partner violence are a violation offitle IX. Sexual misconduct includes sexual harassment, sexual assault, rape, stalking and intimate partner violence.

WHAT TO DO

- 1. If someone tells you that they were sexually harassed, assaulted aped or stalked, rst offer them support. But emphasize to them that as a faculty member, staff member, student leader or other employee of the College with supervisory and leadership responsibilities, you are required to report sexual misconduct. As a responsible employee, you are a private resource, but not a con dential resource.
- Listen to them and encourage them to seek help and counseling as soon as possible.
- The person's health and safety should be your primary concernif the person's health and safety are in jeopaldy, contact Campus Safety at 909.607.2000 or local law enforcement at 911.
